I would like to share it with you...






"I'd like to tell you about my mum. She put her hope in Jesus and when I became a teenager, I did too."

"As her illness got worse, she became very demanding. When it all got too much for we, I would stand outside her door and ask Jesus to help me be the loving person that I wanted to be."

"But then she began to forget things. The saddest thing my mum ever said to me was "When did we meet?"."



"Mum died on a Sunday and at Church we sang about how we will dance together with Jesus one day. That's what I'm looking forward to... dancing with her in the new world God has waiting for us."

"This hope helps me as I get older — I'm in my 70s now. My time on this earth is limited and my body doesn't work as well as it used to.
